My suggestion would be to enquire whether everything was in order when they returned, and then make a comment along the lines of how diligent Jason was. Stress to them how much care and effort he took. It would probably be at that point that your neighbours would realise their oversight.

If these people neglect to pay Jason or reward him in some meaningful way, I would definitely not allow Jason to help them out again. It doesn't seem very fair does it?

I would also suggest that you reward Jason for his efforts and explain that most people are not so stingy and that he shouldn't lose faith because of their oversight. Looking after someone else's pets is a huge responsibility and Jason's probably saved them hundreds of dollars that would ordinarily be spent at the cattery or kennel. 🐾
